It is true that anyone who arrives in Rimini feel immediately at home, but to move around the city by a true local, there are some must visit places which cannot be ignored.

The true native certainly does not miss the walk to the harbor, a walk along the "palata" (pier) that starts from the ancient eighteenth-century lighthouse and arrives to the Rock Island, a historical place that has become the postcard of the east pier.

Here in the summer there is the collective ritual of waiting for the sunset, takes place so is a must to stop and admire the colors reflected on the water and the horizon until the sun disappears.

The whole waterfront, from north to south, is a very popular area among the locals, who enjoy walking or cycling there. The new reference point is undoubtedly the **Parco del Mare** (Sea Park) with the Belvedere, an area liberated from cars and transformed into a green oasis overlooking the beach.

The meeting point for an aperitif is in the historic center, at the cantinette (wine bars) of the **Vecchia Pescheria** or at **Borgo San Giuliano** district. On the seaside, the darsena area is very popular, both for dinner and aperitif, with its new urban architectures blending with the low, row-like houses of the fishermen.

Rimini residents love cycling, and one of the areas worth reaching on two wheels to enjoy the open air and greenery is the **Piazza sull'Acqua** (Square on the Water) at the Tiberius Bridge, a beautiful park where you can engage in sports activities (we recommend yoga classes), sunbathe, or grab a quick bite to eat, like a piadina, the quintessential street food. Piadina can be found everywhere, but the real competition is between the beach kiosks and those in the hills. The choice is yours.

When it comes to food, Rimini has it all, and the city is always on the move in this regard too. New establishments, shops, and bistros attentive to contemporary taste trends continually open in both the beach area and the city center. Our local gourmets are connected to traditional cuisine but are also open - as it should be - to innovations.

Authentic shopping is strictly in the historic heart of the city, in the streets between Piazza Cavour and Piazza Tre Martiri. Alongside flagship stores, you'll also find concept stores, original proposals, and young designers of the new generation.
